Demonstration of existing approaches, tools, and techniques as well as discussion of synergies, will provide a point of departure for developing improved interfaces to massive amounts of semantic web data for researchers, educators and the general public alike.

The goals of the meeting are:

- Present and discuss current research in semantic web research and science map making.
- Identify synergistic collaboration opportunities and challenges.
- Outline a course of activities over the next 5 years."
